Díaz Noci, Javier (Universitat Pompeu Fabra. Departament de Comunicació. Roc Boronat, 138 – 08018 - Barcelona): **Cibercultura en tiempos de pandemia: Aceleración y retroceso en la adaptación digital** (Cyberculture in times of pandemic: going back and forward in the digital adaptation) (Orig. es)

Bastract: This article, written as an essay, deals about the many implications that the new SAR-CoV-2 virus poses for cyberculture, and which might be its future. As the concept of culture, cyberculture, or culture for the digital networks –and most especially, the World Wide Web– is a rather flexible concept, in which many practices, values and manifestations are included. The background of cyberculture is a set of ideas often exposed as neutral, unavoidable or technologically determined. Examined with some detail, those ideologies have implications for governance, global economy, inequality and the everyday life of people. Abstract: The aim of this article is to investigate the linguistic feature in the communication on-line communication of young Basque bilingual university students, who live in Navarre and communicate in both languages. We are mainly interested in three points: first of all what *code switching* (CS) model can be identified; secondly, how the standard / dialectal Basque relationship is reflected in these texts and finally how linguistic adequacy appears. This work shows that CS is a sign of personal identification among young people; it is a way, among others, to achieve expressiveness and to underline playful appearance. On the other hand, we observe features of language-adequacy, thus the local features of a dialect can be used by young people from different geographical origins backgrounds, underlining the phenomenon of accommodation.

Abstract: The phenomenon known as the 'longevity revolution' is generating a series of deep-rooted changes in the living conditions of older adults. Their unanimous desire to remain in their home and in familiar surroundings, or if this is not possible, to move to domestic facilities that enable them to feel like they are living 'at home', has prompted a complete rethinking of our long-term care model, a process which has been under way in the international field for various decades now. Years ago, the concept of nursing home/institution gave way to that of accommodation/housing. Almost all of Europe is moving in this direction, from a variety of different starting points and through a wide range of initiatives that can be summed up as formulas which guarantee that older adults can retain their dignity in their everyday lives, even when they need help. In this collaborative study, we describe a set of international experiences, presenting them as 'best practices' that are potentially generalisable to other regions, such as the Basque Country.
