## Ander Errasti

Dr Ander Errasti is a political philosopher with expertise in how globalisation is reshaping nations and nationalism, subsequently transforming European democracies. He is currently a researcher at Globernance: Institute of Democratic Governance. PhD in Humanities: Ethics and Political Philosophy at the Pompeu Fabra University (UPF), Advanced LLM in Legal Sciences at the UPF and MA in Political Philosophy at the UPF.

From January onwards, he will be a member of the Young Policy Leaders programme at the European University Institute's School of Transnational Governance. During 2017– 2018 he has developed a policy-research project at the University of Edinburgh's Centre on Constitutional Change (with professors Nicola McEwan and Michael Keating) to analyse the impact of devolution, independence referendum and Brexit on Scotland's self– government. He has also been a visiting doctoral student at Oxford University's Department of Politics and International Relations (under Professor Kalypso Nicolaïdis' supervision).

Dr Errasti has also worked, as a member of the University of Barcelona's GISME group, in the Coordination of European Social Innovation and Disruptive Education projects, including the European Commission's SIforAGE project and the European Institute of Innovation and Technology's Health area's (EIT Health) CCentre educational programme.

He participates in Spanish, Catalan and Basque media (press, radio and TV).

As a fellow of the EUI's School of Transnational Government's Policy Leader's programme, Dr Errasti will be working on policy recommendations that may contribute to overcoming the territorial political and constitutional tensions in Spain.
